

(Square Kufic)

In the University's logo, the **Square Kufic** reads "**Jami'ah Albukhary al-Duwaliyyah**" (Albukhary International University). The Square Kufic (known as **Kufi Murabba' or Kufi Banna'l - masonry script**) is characterised by its unique epigraphic convention; by its angularity, squareness, and strict organising principles by positive and negative space.

"Jami'ah (University)" in blue: produces a calming effect, associated with tranquility and calmness; beneficial to mind and body.

al-Duwaliyyah (International) in turquoise: represents healing properties that affect the mind and body; believed to boost energy, serenity, wholeness and creativity.



"Albukhary" in green: the colour of life, nature and energy; to create balance as well as promote change and growth.

In line with the university's niche area of Social Business, where the focuses are on practical and community-related research rather than theoretical and hypothetical research, a variety of impactful events, projects and collaborations are organised and participated year round by staff and students of AIU.

Social Business Initiative

- "SDG Through 3ZERO: Approach & Practice" (PLS#6) On 25 June 2024, Prof. Charles Hopkins explored integrating sustainability into education to meet global developments goals.
- ACE-SEDI has launched the AIU Social Business Videocast, an initiative promoting the 3ZERO Club
 movement. This videocast aims to increase awareness of how Social Business can effectively address social
 challenges. In collaboration with ten students from BMC, ACE-SEDI has embarked on this project with a focus
 on highlighting the efforts and stories of the 3ZERO Club members.





3ZERO CLUB @AIU

The AIU-Social Business Design Lab is a brainstorming platform for students to cultivate their creative minds to find social solutions and social innovation ideas. We believe that in order for social solutions and social innovation ideas to be invented, students need to be actively engaged in community projects and programme. By doing this, they will have a better understanding of the root issues involved, the challenges, strategies to overcome them, and the potential solutions to propose.

Our community engagement programmes are in Baling and Sik, Kedah, and Tawau, Sabah. The potential social solutions or innovations could include new methods, business models, tools and equipment, software, or apps that improve the quality of life for people living in poverty. These solutions will then be turned into Social Business ideas. This lab is divided into three clusters, aiming to work toward a World of 3Zeros as called by Professor Muhammad Yunus: 1. Zero Poverty, 2. Zero Unemployment, and 3. Zero Net Carbon Emission.

The MACE

It is a gold sceptre, or mace of North Indian origin, possibly from Rajasthan, made in the first half of the 19th century with carved floral motifs in three sections with a rosewood core. The pommel is inlaid with a large emerald surrounded by rubies and diamonds forming a floral design. Surrounding the flower is a register of carved birds with inlaid ruby eyes, interrupted by floral sprays. The lip of the pommel is decorated with square-cut diamonds.

The mace first made its present-time appearance at AIU Convocation Hall on March 26, 2022, during the inaugural convocation ceremony of the university. Historically recognized as a type of ceremonial device, it was carried by the entourage of the ruler of its time. Today, it is carried by its designated bearer and placed at the center of the convocation hall during the ceremony as an emblem of lasting prestige and authority, which represents the important role that the past will always play in the present time, across centuries, cultures, and continents.

Its emblematic uniqueness stands out as it is a significant object from the annex of history that has witnessed much of time and civilizations passing by. Thus, it becomes the perfect symbolism of the University's 5A Core Values which are universal and timeless, unifying people and communities in its humanity and yet acknowledging the beauty in its diversity.


