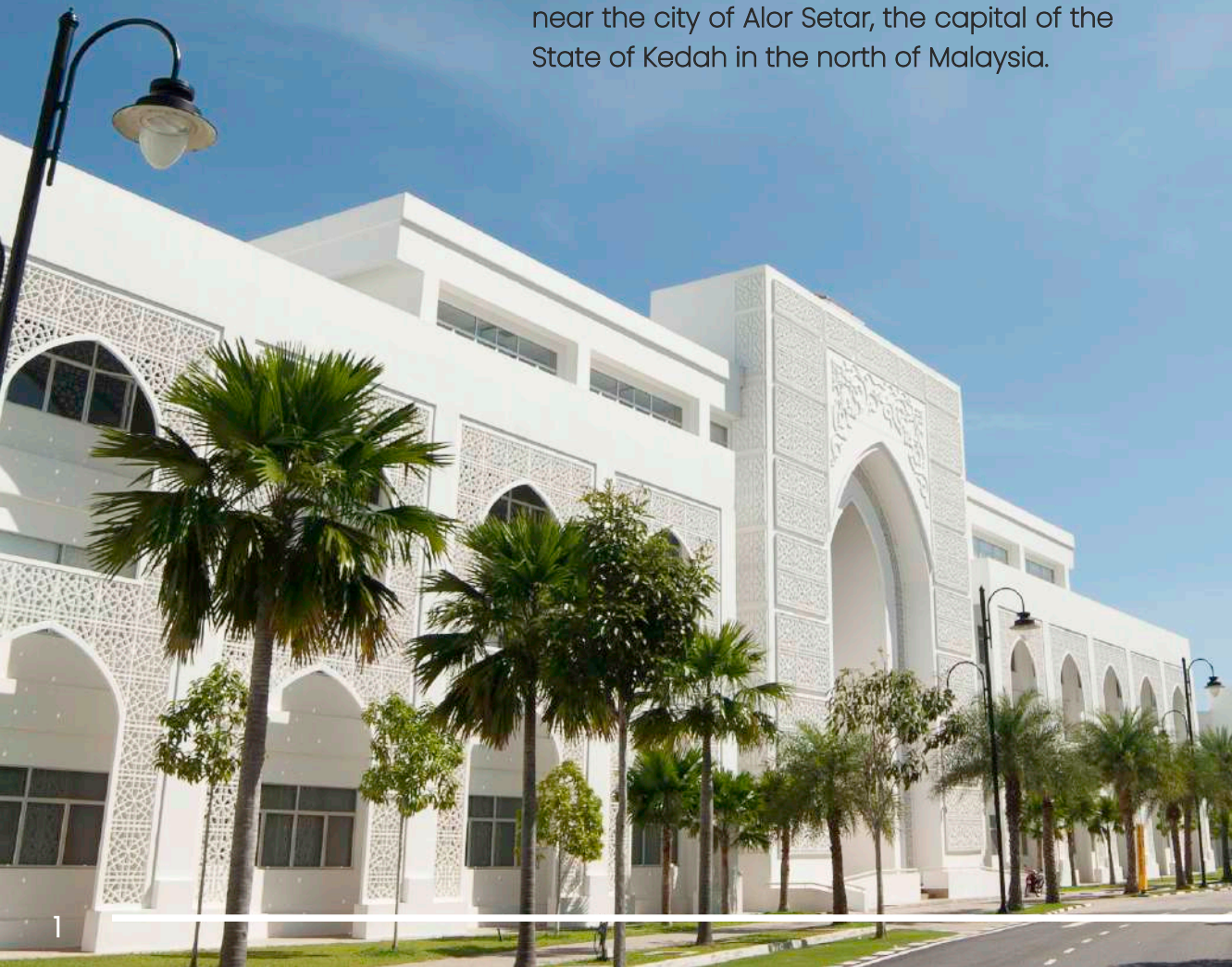




ABOUT AIU

Albukhary International University (AIU) is a private nonprofit education institution with a fully residential campus. It is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities to provide a conducive living and learning environment to students for progressive self-discovery, nurturing relationships and building understanding on global issues. At AIU, students are exposed to a holistic educational approach through a combined academic and social engagement programme which is carried out throughout the study period.

Designed and constructed on a 45 acres (18 hectares) site, the AIU campus is located near the city of Alor Setar, the capital of the State of Kedah in the north of Malaysia.





The inspiring architectural splendour of the University campus is one that mirrors the centres of learning of yesteryears. Consequently, several of its building structures and designs are reminiscent of classical Muslim architecture during the golden age of learning.

However, the beauty of AIU transcends its rich and beautiful architecture and lies in its heart, where the 5As core values are nestled within, and their definition and practise carried out and passed on among the students of diverse ethnicity and nationality from all over the world. Through its vision, mission and core values, AIU is committed to ensuring the highest level of human dignity in line with the concept of “Inspiring Minds” as the core ethos and tagline of the University.

SQUARE KUFIC

In this logo, the square Kufic reads "Jami'ah Albukhary al-Duwaliyyah" (Albukhary International University).

The term square Kufic (known as Kufi Murabba' or Kufi Banna'l – masonry script) became the appropriate identification, during the 11th century, for its unique epigraphic convention. Characterised by its angularity, squareness, and strict organising principles by the positive and negative space, the square Kufic is popular as a decoration on monumental edifices.

The word Albukhary is in **green**; the colour of life, nature and energy. Green helps to create balance as well as promote change and growth.

The word Jami'ah (university) is in **blue**; the colour that produces a calming effect and strongly associated with tranquility and calmness; beneficial to the mind and body.

The word al-Duwaliyyah (international) is in **turquoise**, representing healing properties that affects the mind and body; this colour is believed to boost the energy, wisdom, serenity, wholeness and creativity.

AIU LOGO PHILOSOPHY

The square Kufic, also used in the logo of the Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia, was selected as the new logo of the Albukhary International University because the aforementioned institutions are the symbolic entities founded and supported by the Albukhary Foundation. On the one hand, the Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia seeks to nurture a deeper appreciation for the influence of Islamic civilization throughout the globe, and on the other hand, the Albukhary International University was founded with the aim of inclusion in the field of higher education.

In totality, the colours of the new Albukhary International University logo captures the essence of the university's motto, which is "inspiring minds towards a better world."

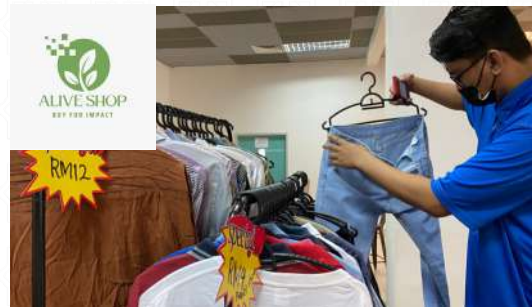

THE MACE

It is a gold sceptre, or mace of North Indian origin, possibly from Rajasthan, made in the first half of the 19th century with carved floral motifs in three sections with a rosewood core. The pommel is inlaid with a large emerald surrounded by rubies and diamonds forming a floral design. Surrounding the flower is a register of carved birds with inlaid ruby eyes, interrupted by floral sprays. The lip of the pommel is decorated with square-cut diamonds.

The mace first made its present-time appearance at AIU Convocation Hall on March 26, 2022 during the inaugural convocation ceremony of the university. Historically recognized as a type of ceremonial device, it was carried by the entourage of the ruler of its time. Today, it is carried by its designated bearer and placed at the centre of the convocation hall during the ceremony as an emblem of lasting prestige and authority which represents the important role that the past will always play in the present time, across centuries, cultures and continents.

Its emblematic uniqueness stands out as it is a significant object from the annex of history that has witnessed much of time and civilisations passing by. Thus, it becomes the perfect symbolism of the university's 5As core values which are universal and timeless, unifying people and communities in its humanity and yet acknowledging the beauty in its diversity.
